2. Review of previous minutes

3. Chairman's report

See Appendix 1 – for Chairman's Report.

Summary – Welcome from Sam Wade, thanks to all in the smooth running of the club. Sam has been chair for the last 2 years but is now wishing to reduce her commitment, ideally stepping down if there is someone else to take over, she will however remain within the club to provide support.

Last year Ann stepped down from Juniors but thankfully lots of people stepped up and are making it a success with a great team effort – this was a key goal from last years AGM.

The Sam White event run by Beth, along with the building relationships with schools is going well – another key goal from last years AGM.

The revamped summer hockey last year was a success as it encouraged some additional players and returning players. Summer hockey will run again this year, the only change being payment upfront.

Coaching within the club is focussed on encouraging people to join in. Juniors still need some coaches but senior coaching slots are full.

Female goalkeepers to be recruited but this is a general hockey issue not just Newark.

England Hockey AGM will affect fee structure at the club and a proposal will be made in the Treasurer's report next.

Some future challenges on wider inclusiveness to be considered following England Hockey lead.

Vice roles additional to the votes to help aid the future of the committee going forwards.

4. Treasurer's report

See Appendix 2 – for Treasurers Report and England Hockey Letter to Newark Hockey Club.

Summary – Income and expenditure – Surplus of just over £200.

A few less membership fees as the Ladies 4 disbanded, match fees were adjusted last year the match fees, but the cost of pitch, which is the biggest cost, has risen despite being a team less. Other fees include umpire fees, affiliation fees to England Hockey, entry to different age group fees, equipment such as the new keeper kit, first aid kit, hockey balls, etc.

The end of season event broke even and sponsorship has helped the club. The Juniors had sponsorship for their end of season medals this year from Whistlers pharmacy, other sponsorship to the club includes contributions from Gusto and British Sugar. There is also the option to purchase playing shirts from Mad Dog if people don't want to wear the club shirts. Everyone to look for additional opportunities for funds as the club could do with more face masks, for example.

England Hockey have raised the affiliation fees as the existing £8 a head was insufficient. They are now looking to lower the per team cost but raise the per head costs for all. As part of the adjustment to pricing some courses will become free to encourage more people to become involved. Newark are challenging the per head numbers that England Hockey have quoted for the club. England Hockey believes the club has 180 players, but it is closer to 112 adults. Either way, the cost increase is over £1000. Pitch hire is also going up again probably by another £1000 in total for all of the teams. Both are likely to go up by inflation again next year.

Proposals to cover the cost increases for next year:

- Membership fee to go up £10 per year - Adults £160, Juniors/Concession £100 - **APPROVED**
- Match tax £10 home, £5 away (PAYP £10 home and away) - **APPROVED**
- Umpires £15 per year – **APPROVED**
- PAYP to stay at £80 for adults and £50 for juniors after last years increase.
- Options for paying all, paying 6 monthly and family discount remain.

Questions:

Payment to England Hockey is now delayed until mid Nov so clubs will know who is registered with them for the season, but the numbers are based on an average over the last couple of years and are not continually updated throughout the season.

Occasional member – price to be updated and set at the England Hockey charge of £16 –

APPROVED

Fundraising – can we reintroduce it as some companies will match funds. For example it may be possible to use the summer tournament (£100 per team for non-Newark team, £10 a head for Newark players) as a fund raising option on application forms? Previously the club did do Newark showground parking in conjunction with Newark Rugby club but we struggled to get people there so now the Rugby club does it alone. There have historically also been sponsored events. As will activities, just needs people to organise events and keep within the rules and regulations.

Grants people can apply for – Notts County Council, pitch cleaning, back to hockey around the time of the Olympics, specific grants are sometimes difficult to apply for as we don't own the facility.

5. Section reports

a. Junior Section – Briony Leighton

Summary – Adapted to working as a team who are very approachable and worked through issues as they have arisen. Junior helpers are invaluable too and may develop into the future leaders for the club.

Losing 3 coaches so the U12 coaches will need some interim support.

Successes U12 Girls in the finals, Badgers re-introduced which have been a success as it gives the younger players more experience, developing links to other junior clubs with some informal tournaments.

Questions:

Transition from Juniors to Senior Match play – how do you identify the juniors that are ready to play seniors. Coaches often identify the U14s who have turned 13 and are ready to try seniors. Over 13s can then also start training mid-week at adult hockey. Maybe get some of the senior members to also visit on a Sunday to introduce themselves?

Perhaps more of a system is needed to identify 13 year olds. On the Google Drive there is a transition document for 13 year olds which could be a starting point for linking to the Badgers. Also to better inform parents that post 13 adult hockey is an option, but need to manage expectations as not all 13 year olds will be ready. Coaches WhatsApp group could be used to flag who may be ready.

Thanks to Briony for her efforts in keeping the juniors running, she puts in a lot of unseen effort.

b. Ladies Section – Hannah Peters

Summary – Ladies 2s finished 3rd in the table, Ladies 1s are now promoted into Division 3, Ladies 3s and 4s teams merged successfully. Still low availability for Ladies 3s some weeks even though theoretically 22 players are available. At the start of the season 50 ladies players in total roughly but this drops by end of the season to a position where there is only just enough for 3 teams. Full complement of coaches next season, with the key aim till to get the Ladies 2s promoted next season.

Questions:

Development team has rules and fines if not completing matches. For some clubs the development team is all they have, otherwise the club would no longer be represented. Most clubs with multiple Ladies teams no longer have a development team.

c. Mens Section – Danny Hendrie via Simon Higgs

Summary – all teams improved, Mens 1 mid table with 6 wins in a row, Mens 2s had 8 wins in a row, not sure if Mens 3 will be relegated despite having over 20 points. Some teams are folding their lower Mens teams so it may be ok. Sometimes 3-4 subs per team and other times only just making numbers. A good mix of coaches and cover available. Some key players are leaving over the summer so there will be some shuffling of players between teams, juniors and new recruits.

d. Development Section – Stuart Gallon

Summary – Thanks to the coaches and the great collaboration of people.

Checks on records for DBS, badges certificates on going –as always, need more people to help and encourage the uptake of the now free England Hockey courses. Encourage more parents to become more involved and have been looking into whether Back to Hockey could run on a Sunday at the same time as junior training. Weekly it is good but there needs to be more resilience to support the long term future of the team. Talking to Lincoln Uni to see if we can get a pipeline of students involved going forwards.

Appendix 1 – Chairman's Report

First of all, a big welcome to NHC AGM and thanks for taking the time and trouble to attend. After all, the club belongs to its members and the committee is a representation of member views on how the club should be run.

I would like to extend my thanks to the committee of 2024/25 – they have all worked extremely hard to make the club what it is and each and every role is very important to the smooth running of the club.

Since taking over as Chair 2 years ago, I have found that whilst it is not an easy task, it is one that has brought me into contact with all sections of the club and I have got to know many people that I did not know before. As you are probably aware, my playing days are coming to an end – whilst the mind is still willing, the body is protesting too much. I think that it would also be a good time to stand down as Chair and let someone else have a turn at moving the club forwards.

Last year, Ann stepped down as Head of Juniors and there was a lot of worry about how the section would cope without her encyclopedic knowledge of all things junior hockey as well as her exceptional organizational skills to make all that happen. Well, look at the team fly now – many parents have stepped into the huge chasm left by Ann and the Dream Team of Hannah, Sarah and Emma has been expanded to include Stu, Briony, Tarquin and Natalie as well as other parents and coaches to ensure the smooth running. They believed they could – and they did. Well done team!

The running of the Junior Section was one of the key goals from last year's AGM and I think that box is well and truly ticked.

Another key goal was the building of relationships with local schools. Our recent Sam White trophy afternoon, run by Beth and her willing helpers proved that this goal too has been met and was featured in the Advertiser.

Beth has also been instrumental in promoting the Club via its social channels, with the help of Millie the photographer. The content presented the club to the outside world on such a level that we have recruited new players and we will continue to build on this success throughout the next season in a similar vein.

The newly revamped summer hockey in 2024 was a success, minimizing pitch costs and maximizing hockey. We also recruited a few new players and persuaded some ex members to return. The summer season will start again next Wednesday (30th) and this year we have asked for payment up-front to aid those organizing sessions, as last year some payments were missed and this can be the difference between profit and loss. We have received feedback about these changes but will stick with it for now but please let us know if you do have any comments – either about summer hockey or anything else within the club.

Coaching has always been a tricky one, but the committee have worked hard on encouraging people to coach and help and it looks like we should be fully staffed on the senior side for next season. The juniors require a bit more input from parents to help with coaching, but on the whole can get by if they need to. Coaching the juniors is a good way to start, so please do get in touch if you are interested in helping out.

The new committee will no doubt identify key goals for the next year, so there is plenty of time to have your say here and influence the priorities. One key item will be recruitment of female goalkeepers, but this is not just a Newark problem.

I recently attended the EH AGM, where a new membership model was outlined and which will affect the way we look at the fee structure at the club. Simon will cover more of this in the Treasurer's report and will also put a proposal to the floor on our suggested new membership fees.


At the risk of repeating my report from last year, I would implore members to do their bit for the club. Pay on time, turn up on time, mark availability or otherwise on Teamo, respect the umpires and generally behave yourself and help out wherever possible!

I hope that the next committee will continue the good work and foundations of those who have gone before them – there are certainly challenges they will have to face head on, such as the rising costs of the game and the legislative requirements not only about running the club, but also about individuals and inclusiveness. Newark has always prided itself on being a very friendly and welcoming club and long may that continue.

Whilst I am choosing to step away from the chair-ship of the club – a role I have been very proud to hold - I am still about to help out and will start by running the summer hockey sessions. When it comes to the elections shortly, it would be nice to think that not only could we fill all the roles, but perhaps also have folk waiting in the wings – at least as Vice Chair and Vice Men's and Ladies captains. This means that there can be a seamless transition should anyone step away and they also have support in the meantime.

Here's to a good season of summer hockey and a glut of goalies!

Dear Club Representative,

Thank you for taking the time to attend our briefings on the proposed changes to the England Hockey Club Membership Model. We truly appreciate your dedication to the sport and the invaluable time you invest in hockey. Passing costs onto clubs is something we have sought to avoid and we have only reached this point after careful consideration.

As outlined in our presentation, rising costs due to inflation, the nature of our ring-fenced funding from Sport England and UK Sport, and the temporary freeze on increases during Covid have now created a financial gap that must be addressed. In response, we have already taken significant steps—downsizing our office, reducing staff numbers, and streamlining budgets—to operate as efficiently as possible. However, any further cuts would have a serious impact, either by removing vital support for clubs or introducing charges for services in ways that could hinder the sport's growth.

Our proposed model is designed to achieve the opposite. With a relatively small contribution from all players, we can ensure all players are equally covered by personal accident insurance wherever they play, enhance hockey's visibility, expand access to the sport in schools, and empower a new generation of volunteers by removing the initial costs of training and education in coaching, officiating and safeguarding courses.

We hope you understand the reasoning behind these changes and appreciate that we have carefully considered the views of our members in shaping these proposals. When sharing this information, please ensure your club committee members have access to the full context and supporting materials.

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Proposed New Club Membership Calculation

For regular clubs the new fees have two main elements:

1. **A Club Fee of £175 per adult team** (a reduction of over 25%) – this contributes to the services clubs receive from England Hockey both in administering the game but also supporting clubs (more information can be found here:

<https://www.englandhockey.co.uk/deliver/running-a-club/club-support>)

The club fee is calculated by the number of regular adult teams a club has. This includes teams in adult league structures as well as any regular Masters teams that play in formal, season long leagues and associated games (not knockout competitions).

2. **Player Registration Fees of £10 for Junior U12s and £16 for Teens & Adults** – this new element is a fee directly related to the player and reflects the benefits and services a player receives.

We recognise that club membership numbers fluctuate throughout the season and from year to year. To ensure a **fair and accurate** estimate of regular players in each club, England Hockey has used multiple data points from the **2024-25 season**, including:

- i. **Club Membership Declarations** – The number of players reported by clubs in the annual Club Membership process (this is the only number used for the U12 Player Registration Fee calculation).
- ii. **GMS Team Sheets** – The number of players regularly appearing on adult league match team sheets.
- iii. **England Hockey's Player Estimate** – This is a calculation based on an average of **22 players per team** that is derived from GMS data of the average number of players it takes to put out a league team (based on 1.2 million team sheet records)

Please note that the total registered player list on GMS will **not be** used as this is likely to include duplicate records, occasional players and either lapsed or players that have left the club.

We intend that structuring the calculation this way ensures fairness, consistency, and transparency in determining player registration fees across all clubs. The Club Membership fees are intend to reflect how much hockey you provide.

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** 92% of clubs take out Club Membership+ from England Hockey that includes Personal Accident and Public Liability insurance. If you do not take out Club Membership+ when comparing fees please remember to include your existing premium in the calculation. If the changes are accepted and your club is **not** one of the 92% we recommend you remember to end your existing policy prior to next season as Personal Accident insurance is included in the new model.*

***The previous category was 11-13 age group in existing Club Membership process. The new category in the proposed model is U12 so we have split the numbers 50/50 in the 11-13 age group to create a fee.*

**** Current VAT is applied on one third of the Membership fee. A review is currently being undertaken to review the VAT policy in line with the new Membership model benefits. As soon as this has been concluded, we will be able to confirm the VAT calculation for the proposed Membership changes.*
